Since 1976, CICC has served as the voice of California's chemical industry. Our goal is to be a part of the solution in shaping the California regulatory climate. Our primary mission is to represent and advocate for our members before the California legislature and regulatory agencies. We routinely engage with legislators as well as CalEPA, CalOSHA, the California Air Resources Board, the Office of Emergency Services (OES), the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), the FBI, and InfraGard Chapters across the state in a proactive effort to emphasize universal protection of critical infrastructure, and compliance with the federal Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorist Standards (CFATS).

As a member, you have many opportunities to stay connected year-round. CICC members meet virtually twice a month to discuss pending legislative and regulatory activities pertaining to environmental, safety & security issues. The membership also assembles each year in Sacramento for two days of interactive, face-to-face meetings with key legislators and regulators, and to conduct our annual meeting. We usually combine it with a fun activity, like dinner at a Sacramento River Cats baseball game.

The CICC staff also produces monthly reports emailed to members, including advocacy reports and weekly updates on Sacramento government actions. The CICC website, www.cicc.org, is an important member communications tool, and we would be pleased to provide you with Guest access to the site as well as our twice monthly web-meetings.
